## Serving the Community

Our vision is to build a local church marked by our passion to love God, love others, live with integrity and live as witnesses. We want to be ready in every situation that God gives to serve and love the community around us. We had an opportunity to do just that in a very practical way. Partnering with students from a local international school, many of the guys from the dorm at New Life Fellowship worked and served by washing the motorbikes of those passing by the church. We were able to show the community who we are and what we believe as followers of Jesus. Within 3 hours, we washed more than 70 motorbikes and shared the love of Christ with everyone who came in.



Students sat and spoke with those waiting for their motos to be finished, sharing with them about who Jesus is. They also received literature for them to take

home. Our heart is to serve, and in serving, many will hear and believe in Him.

## HARVESTERS RESPOND WITH LOVE

The flooding in central and northern Cambodia made an already fragile economy even more strained. In the affected provinces, homes were lost; crops were lost; lives were lost. During a prayer time in the Harvesters, a discipleship/missions class at NLF PPT, God began to prompt our hearts to respond in some way. The students asked, "What can we do to help?" The answer came from God very clearly. First: "I am going and I want you to come with Me." Second: "Provision comes with obedience." And that provision did come! Over the course of one week, donations were made beyond what we could imagine, making it possible to purchase more than 2,200 pounds of rice, as well as some other very necessary cooking basics. We prepared 100 packages of food for the people of a small village in Kampong Thom. During the distribution, we prayed and asked God to bless them and reveal Himself to them.



As we served and loved this community, many people took notice of what was happening...and who was doing these things. The village chief commented that he was amazed to see this group of young people that came really did care about the village and at the work that Christians do to serve and help.

## GOALS FOR 2012

To be **strengthened** in the following areas:

- 1. Church Services** on Sunday morning, Wednesday night and Saturday night.
- 2. Cell Groups** for adults and children.
- 3. Discipleship System** with Sunday Bible school class, Harvesters, and One-on-One discipleship
- 4. Children's Ministry** with cell groups and Sunday school classes.
- 5. Office Skills Training School** with ESL, computer skills and integrity at work.
